Student should be able to show prior interest and or education in the field. Criteria for awarding scholarships include student motivation, enthusiasm, and commitment. GPA and scholarship will be considered, but are not the deciding factor. High school students, college students, and non-traditional students are invited to apply. Scholarships are typically set at \$500.
